Two exciting half day workshops in Tower Hamlets when civil rights activists, artists, educators and writers will bring together history, the arts and social action to explore methods of nonviolent community action for social justice.

- **Thursday 13th October, 2-5 pm (£25 per person):** 'Train the Trainers' afternoon for teachers and youth workers looking at ways of using history, arts and media to inspire young people to be involved in action for change. Activities on topics ranging from Freedom Rides to the Matchgirls Strike, from storytelling to the art of protest, from migration history to Black Lives Matter UK.
- **Monday 5th December (£5 per person), 2-5 pm:** afternoon for young people with workshops on the music of protest and stories of action for change in Tower Hamlets. Anti poverty action, art and identity, voter registration, women and girls against racism and how to campaign. A chance, too, to meet Jean Stallings whose anti-poverty work in the 1960s was part of the US civil rights movement.

Both events will be at the Brady Centre, 192-196 Hanbury St E1 5HU.
