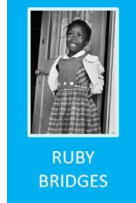


There is a question about news items and taking action. If you like, write your answer on a blue tag.

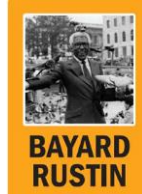

- What were the marchers asking for?

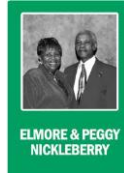
Listen to some of the people on the march.
